Best Practice 1: Empowering Students to Excel in Sports

Objectives of the Practice: Janta Vedic College in Baghpat, Uttar Pradesh, emphasizes sports as a crucial part of student development, especially for students from rural backgrounds where sports are culturally significant. Practice: The Department of Physical Education organizes annual sports meets and facilitates student participation in intercollegiate, zonal, and national competitions.

Evidence of Success: Students have earned medals in various sports, including wrestling, athletics, taekwondo, and boxing, with notable performances by athletes like Sneha and Adesh Kumar.

Problems Encountered: Financial limitations restrict access to specialized coaching and expert trainers, hindering the students' ability to receive advanced training.


Best Practice 2: Facilitating Faculty Training to Improve Research Capabilities

Objectives of the Practice: This initiative aims to enhance faculty members' research capabilities by improving skills, encouraging interdisciplinary collaboration, and increasing the quality and quantity of publications.

The Context: In the face of rapid advancements in various fields, faculty members need continuous training to stay current. Limited access to reputed journals and funding challenges hinder research productivity.

Practice: Faculty members have participated in workshops, refresher courses, and faculty development programs at renowned institutions. Notably, Dr. Shyam Kishor's collaboration with BARC on the DAE-BRNS project is a prime example of successful interdisciplinary research.

Evidence of Success: Over 50 research papers were published in peer-reviewed journals, including four in Scopus-indexed journals, and faculty training fostered more collaborative research efforts.
