

## Activities conducted through MoUs

### 1. A short report on Stitching and Embroidery Training Programme at Janta Vedic College, Baraut

A 90-day Stitching and Embroidery Training Program was successfully conducted at Janta Vedic College, Baraut by the Skill Development Committee under the aegis of IQAC from 30th October 2025 to 24th March 2026. For the successful implementation of this program, a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed with Singer India Limited, which provided valuable support and guidance in conducting the training. The program was organized under the Skill Development Course in Apparel Designing, by the CCS University, Meerut. A total of 157 registrations were received for the program. Out of these, 75 candidates were admitted, and finally, 59 students successfully completed the training program.

During the training period, the students actively participated and showed keen interest in both stitching and embroidery. They gained practical skills and developed proficiency in various aspects of garment making. The trainees also prepared record files and learned to design and stitch different types of garments.

The program proved to be highly beneficial as it enhanced the confidence and skills of the participants, making them more capable in the field of tailoring and embroidery. At the end of the program, certificates were awarded to all the successful participants by the college. Overall, the training program was conducted smoothly and achieved its objective of skill development among the students.
